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Call for proposals!

In line with the objectives of HiE, the HiE Steering Committee (SC) has decided to commission the **development of a status document in order to get an overview of the current initiatives on monitoring and evaluation of HIV testing in Europe**. A working group on monitoring testing within the SC of HiE has been established to follow testing related activities and follow this assignment. The output of this assignment is to provide strategic input to HiE and other European organisations to guide future agenda and activities. The consultancy is expected to start **1 July 2016** and the overall timeframe for the project duration is four months from contract signature. Read more about the Terms of References [here](#). European Testing Week

The results of the 2015 European Testing Week are now available! **417 partners** participated in the 2015 European Testing week, which for the first time included hepatitis testing. Of those, 47% submitted the evaluation survey. The majority were NGOs/CSOs (66%). The general population was most frequently targeted (66%), and 97% of survey respondents did HIV activities, 45% hepatitis C activities and 28% hepatitis B activities, including testing and outreach testing and awareness-raising. This year, the results have been put together as a [one-pager](#) and a [slideset](#) to be used and distributed by participants and other interested parties as they see fit.

EUROPEAN HIV-HEPATITIS TESTING WEEK 2015 Results from the 2015 Evaluation

Summary: 417 partners from 53 countries in the WHO European Region participated in the 2015 European Testing week, which for the first time included hepatitis testing. Of those, 47% submitted the evaluation survey. The majority were NGOs/CSOs (66%). The general population was most frequently targeted (66%), and 97% of survey respondents did HIV activities, 45% hepatitis C activities and 28% hepatitis B activities, including testing and outreach testing and awareness-raising.
